

Outlaw Team Series Tournament Rules

Updated 11/27/2023

- 1. All State, Coast Guard, Federal Parks & Wildlife regulations shall apply at all times. A violation of any of these regulations could result in a Team surrendering their stringer and/or being disqualified.
- 2. <u>Teams</u>: All tournaments are Team Tournaments. A Team cannot consist of more than two (2) anglers, but a Team may consist of only one (1) angler. Only Registered Tournament Anglers are allowed in a Team's boat during Tournament Hours.
- 3. <u>Participation & Eligibility</u>: Participation is open to anyone 18 years or older. Anyone under the age of 18 must be partnered with a team member over 18 years of age and have a completed and signed Minor's Release. (See the Form Section on Outlaw Outdoors' website for Minor's Release) The following are <u>NOT</u> eligible to enter:
 - Any angler that has committed to compete in 2024 in a B.A.S.S. Elite Series Event, an MLF Invitational Tournament, MLF Redcrest Series or Bass Pro Tour Event
 - Any angler that has guided for largemouth bass on Tournament Waters in the preceding 14 days of Tournament for any method of compensation
 - Any angler the Tournament Director should decide to refuse entry

4. Off-Limits:

Tournament #1 – January 14

Starts: Monday, January 8

Ends: Sunday, January 14

Practice Days: Friday & Saturday, January 12-13 (must be pre-entered to practice)

On practice days for this tournament, teams are allowed to have anyone in their boat with them. This exception is ONLY for this tournament because of the SETX High School Tournament on Saturday, January 13th.

Tournament #2 – February 24

Starts: Monday, February 19

Ends: Saturday, February 24

Practice Days: Monday - Friday, February 19-23 (must be pre-entered to practice)

On practice days for this tournament, teams are allowed to have anyone in their boat with them. This exception is ONLY for this tournament because of the MLF Toyota Series Tournament the week of this tournament.

Tournament #3 – April 13

<u>Starts</u>: Monday, April 8 <u>Ends</u>: Saturday, April 13 <u>Practice Day</u>: Friday, April 12 <u>(must be pre-entered to practice)</u>

Tournament #4 – May 11

<u>Starts</u>: Monday, May 6 <u>Ends</u>: Saturday, May 11 <u>Practice Day</u>: Friday, May 10 <u>(must be pre-entered to practice)</u> <u>Championship – June 1-2</u> <u>Starts</u>: Tuesday, May 28 <u>Ends</u>: Saturday, June 1 <u>Practice Day</u>: Friday, May 31 (must be pre-entered to practice)

- 5. Official Practice (ONLY applies to teams pre-registered): Official practice begins at 6:00 AM and ends at 6:00 PM. Teams must be off the water by 6:00 PM. Teams MUST be pre-registered in order to practice during official practice day. No Team Member may be on or in The Tournament Waters during practice day <u>unless</u> the Team is registered for the Tournament. Therefore, a Team may only be on Tournament Waters during Official Practice Day if the Team is registered before their boat enters Tournament Waters. Only paid contestants and their immediate family members (spouse/children/parents/siblings) may be in the Team's Boat during the Official Practice Day (with the exception of Tournament #1 and Tournament #2). Team Members are allowed to practice in separate boats. TEAM MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED IN ORDER TO PRACTICE DURING OFFICIAL PRACTICE DAY.
- 6. **Information:** Other than information available publicly, <u>no</u> fishing information may be purchased, bartered, solicited or otherwise received from any person after midnight Sunday preceding the tournament, <u>whether pre-registered or not.</u>
- 7. <u>Registration</u>: Teams will have two options to enter:
 - 1. Enter online prior to the Tournament at <u>OutlawOutdoors.com</u>. Online registration will end at midnight on Friday.
 - 2. Enter onsite the Friday before the Tournament from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM
 - 3. THERE WILL BE NO ONSITE REGISTRATION THE MORNING OF THE TOURNAMENT.
- 8. <u>Trailering</u>: Regular season tournaments will allow all teams to trailer. Contestants may launch at any <u>PUBLIC</u> boat ramp. No fishing until official start time. Official start and stop time will be announced prior to tournament and will be determined by cell phone service. No team may be on tournament waters prior to 4:00am on Tournament Day.
- 9. <u>**Refunds**</u>: No refund of entry fees will be allowed, nor will entry fees be transferred to a future tournament.
- 10. Official Boat/Livewell Check (For Championship Only): Each Team is required to idle by the Check Out Dock for a boat & livewell inspection during takeoff the morning of the Tournament. The order in which Teams proceed through the inspection is determined by Boat Number. Failure to go through boat inspection during Tournament Takeoff will result in disqualification from such Tournament. During Tournament Takeoff, all teams are required to idle past "no wake" buoys or a minimum of 100 yards (whichever is less) before putting the boat on plane. Should Tournament Director allow trailering, no Official Boat/Livewell Check will be required.
- 11. <u>Trailering Is Not Allowed (For Championship Only)</u>: All boats must leave the Official Check Out Dock by boat in the order designated at registration. Contestants may launch their boat at a public ramp other than the designated take-off location, but all Teams must come by the Official Check Out Dock in the order designated at registration. Team's boat should remain within the waters of Tournament Lake throughout the Tournament. Trailering may be allowed at the discretion of the Tournament Director. Should trailering be allowed, specific information concerning takeoff and weigh in will be posted at weigh in site during registration hours.
- 12. Official Team Check In (For Championship Only): Each Team must check in at the Official Check In Dock by their designated time based on the Team's Boat Number. It is the sole responsibility of each Team to arrive at the Official Check In Dock on time. Each Team will receive a Boat Number Card at registration which will show each Team's Check In Time. All fishing must cease upon check-in. A Team will be penalized one (1) pound for every minute they are late to the Check In Dock. This penalty will be first applied to the Team's Big Bass. If Team has no Big Bass, it will be applied towards their overall stringer. If a Team is over 15 minutes late, the team will be disqualified. Should Tournament Director allow trailering, no Check In is required.
- 13. <u>Opening/Closing Of The Scales</u>: Any team wishing to weigh fish must be in the weigh-in line with their fish prior to stated weigh in time based on boat number. Any team not in weigh-in line with their fish by their designated weigh-in time will be assessed a one (1) pound penalty per minute from their total weight including any weight towards Big Bass Award. Any contestant more than fifteen (15)

minutes late will forfeit that day's stringer. Scales will open at noon on tournament day. No Teams are allowed to weigh in prior to scales opening. All Teams must be in weigh in line by designated time.

- 14. **Boat Requirements**: All boats must be equipped with emergency kill switch. Kill switch must be attached to Boat Operator at all times while combustible engine is in operation. Kill switch must operate properly. US Coast Guard approved life jackets are required for each person in boat. Life jackets must be worn and fastened while combustible engine is in operation. All boats must have a functioning live well that is adequate to keep the tournament limit of fish alive.
- 15. <u>Method of Fishing</u>: All bass must be caught on artificial bait by casting. No trolling with main outboard motor. Contestant may use only one rod at any one time. Umbrella Rigs/Alabama Rigs are allowed with a maximum of five (5) hooks. Any fish caught while "sight fishing" must be hooked inside the mouth. No snagging of fish. All fishing must be done from inside the Team's boat. At no time can a Team Member leave the boat to land a fish, locate fish or to make the boat more accessible to new water. Each Angler's cast and retrieve must be completed prior to Angler's next cast.
- 16. <u>Dead Fish Penalty</u>: Any dead bass weighed in will result in a deduction of one (1) pound per dead fish applied to their daily weight. Any fish that has been on ice will not be allowed to be weighed in.
- 17. Big Bass must be alive to be eligible for Big Bass Award.
- 18. <u>Minimum Length</u>: Minimum length of bass to be weighed in is fourteen (14) inches. Official measuring board is the CHECK-IT-STIK. Only Largemouth and Kentucky Spotted Bass will be weighed in. Should a Team present a Bass for weigh-in which fails to meet the minimum length limit, Team must surrender remaining daily stringer.
- 19. <u>Culling</u>: No Team may have more than five (5) fish in their possession at any time during official Tournament Hours, except during the culling process whereas six (6) fish are allowed. While one Team member is culling, the other Team member may fish, however, both anglers cannot resume fishing until culling has been completed and Team possesses only five (5) fish. <u>Culling of dead fish is not allowed.</u> A violation of the culling rule will result in the Team surrendering their daily stringer and/or being disqualified.
- 20. <u>Ties</u>: A tie will be resolved by combining the money/points from tied places and splitting it evenly between tied Teams.
- 21. <u>Assistance</u>: During the hours of the Tournament, a Team may not have non-competitors in their boat, receive fishing information from non-competitors or follow a non-competitor's boat or participate in the placing of markers by non-competitors or participate in the practice of "hole sitting" by anyone. The use of mobile communication devices such as cellular telephones, marine radios, walkie-talkies, or any electronic device to obtain fishing information from anyone during tournament hours is strictly prohibited. In the event of an emergency situation, Teams should call 911 first and then notify the Tournament Director at (817) 235-9570.
- 22. <u>Boat/Motor Breakdown</u>: In the event a Team's boat or motor becomes inoperable or in a state that cannot get back to Official Check In, a Team can return to Official Check In by 1) remaining in their boat and being towed to Official Check In, 2) one Team Member, with their daily stringer, may ride in another Competitor's boat back to Official Check In while the other Team Member stays with their inoperable boat or 3) one Team Member, with their daily stringer, may ride with a Tournament Official (if available) back to the Official Check In, while the other Team Member stays with their inoperable boat.
- 23. <u>Polygraph Exam</u>: Each Team member, by submitting an entry form, agrees to submit to a polygraph exam and accept the result of said polygraph exam. Should a Team member fail to pass a polygraph exam, Team will forfeit all winnings and face possible disqualification. If alcohol or mind-altering drugs are consumed prior to a Team's polygraph exam, said Team will forfeit all winnings for the tournament. Team selected for polygraph must be available at the designated exam time. Failure to be available will result in possible surrender of daily stringer and/or disqualification.
- 24. <u>Alcoholic Beverages and Mind-altering Drugs</u>: No alcoholic beverages or mind-altering drugs are to be consumed by any team member during tournament hours or until team required to polygraph has been selected; nor are alcoholic beverages or mind-altering drugs allowed in a team's boat during official tournament hours. Violation of any of the above will result in disqualification of said team.
- 25. <u>Permitted Fishing Areas</u>: Teams may fish anywhere on Tournament Waters by boat that is available to the public, except areas designated as "off limits" or "no fishing" by state or federal officials.

- 26. <u>Off-Limits Areas</u>: Teams may not fish inside any areas designated as "off-limits" or "no fishing" by state or federal officials. There are no other off-limits areas for the tournament.
- 27. <u>Protests</u>: Any protest must be submitted to the tournament director in writing within fifteen (15) minutes of the closing of the scales.
- 28. <u>Boat And Horsepower Regulation</u>: Each boat must have all required U.S. Coast Guard safety equipment. Boats must contain a properly aerated livewell space to maintain a live limit of Bass. Maximum horsepower for all outboards used in tournament competition may not exceed the horsepower limitations as set by the U. S. Coast Guard in such vessel. Falsifying information or altering the horsepower numbers on the motor or rating plate to conceal such limitations will be cause for disqualification from the Tournament. No Contestant may have a platform, raised deck, or ladder which is higher than the gunnel of the boat. Standing on the fishing seats or outboard motor will not be allowed.
- 29. <u>Culling Of Dead Fish</u>: Culling of dead fish is NOT PERMITTED.
- 30. <u>Altering Of A Fish's Weight</u>: No Angler shall perform any act that will alter the weight of a bass that is to be included in their stringer. Tournament officials reserve the right to use any means necessary to inspect any bass that is in question which includes, but not limited to, physical inspection, x-rays, metal detectors, necropsy, etc.
- 31. <u>Sportsmanship and Conduct</u>: All Contestants are required to follow high standards of sportsmanship, courtesy, safety and conservation. Examples of conduct not complying with those standards include, but are not limited to, the following:

• Consumption and/or possession of alcoholic beverages or any mind-altering substance during tournament hours extending through the weigh-in process;

• Any previous conviction, charge, arrest, or investigation for a felony, a crime involving moral turpitude, or a crime related to, arising out of, or involving any fishing tournament or event, except with full, prior written disclosure to the Tournament Director under oath and by affidavit of all facts and circumstances surrounding such conviction, charge, arrest, or investigation at least ten (10) days before the Tournament being entered, and thereafter subject to the Tournament Director's sole and absolute discretion that such conviction, charge, arrest, or investigation does not result in the Contestant's honesty, integrity, character or qualifications to enter the event being unreasonably questionable.

• Actions or words which reflect unfavorably upon efforts to promote safety, sportsmanship, and fair competition;

• Chemical substance abuse or addiction;

• Disqualification from any tournament that resulted from unexplained rule violations that result in a Contestant's honesty, integrity, character, and qualifications for entry into a Tournament being questionable in the Tournament Director's sole and absolute discretion.

Upon review of the circumstances by the Tournament Director, the Tournament Director shall have the right to refuse any entry, or to deny a confirmed entry, by returning the entry fee of a previously accepted entry, or disqualifying a Team.

- 32. Outlaw Outdoors reserves the right to place an official observer in a team's boat at any time during competition hours, place a video/audio recording device in a team's boat and/or have an observation boat follow a team any time during competition hours.
- 33. All decisions of the tournament director are final.
- 34. Tournament director may refuse any entry.
- 35. All Bass weighed in will become the property of Outlaw Outdoors and will be released back into the tournament waters.
- 36. Any person who has been disqualified or banned from any prior tournament may be refused entry into Tournament.
- 37. Violation of any of the aforementioned rules (with exception to rule #13 and #16) will result in an automatic surrender of the Team's stringer for the day and may result in disqualification from the Tournament.
- 38. <u>Championship Qualification</u>: An <u>Angler</u> must enter three (3) of the four (4) regular season tournaments to be eligible for The Championship. Qualification for The Championship is based on an individual basis.
- 39. <u>Outlaw Of The Year</u>: A <u>*Team*</u> must enter three (3) of the four (4) regular season tournaments plus The Championship to be eligible for Outlaw Of The Year. Tournament Director may allow substitutions

should extenuating circumstances arise (death, military deployment, etc). Points will be awarded with 1^{st} place in each tournament receiving 300 points, 2^{nd} place receiving 299 points, etc. Teams that do not weigh in will each receive 20 points less than the last place Team that weighed in at that Tournament. Points earned at The Championship will be calculated the same as regular season tournaments AND DOUBLED. Should there be a tie in points at the end of the season for Outlaw Of The Year, the team having weighed in the heaviest stringer of the series (Tournaments #1 - #4) will be declared Outlaw Of The Year.

40. <u>The Outlaw Ten</u>: The top 10 teams in points after the four (4) regular season tournaments will receive complementary entry fees into the Outlaw Team Series Championship (Thanks to Truth Sports). Should there be a tie in points for 10th place going into the championship, the team having weighed in the heaviest stringer of the series will receive their entry fee paid.

*******The above rules ONLY apply to The Outlaw Team Series Tournaments***

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
